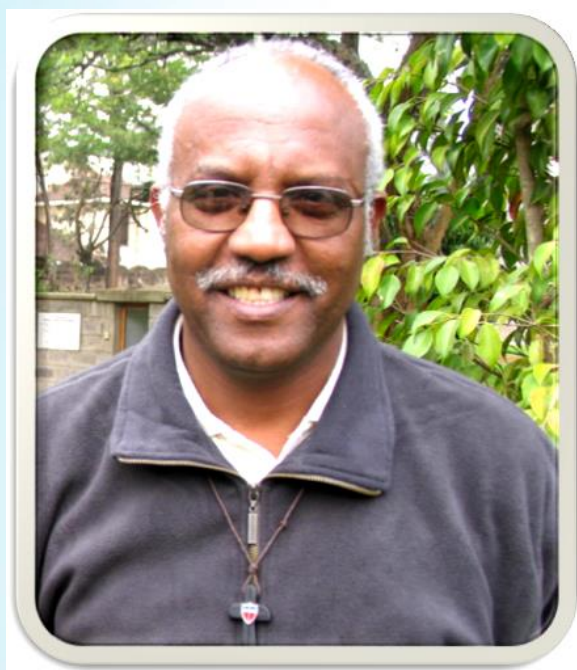

1.1. APPOINTMENT OF A NEW BROTHER VISITOR

Brother Ghebreyesus Habte is the newly appointed Visitor for the Lwanga District of Africa. Br. Ghebreyesus is from the Sector of Eritrea, currently, the Director/Principal of Hagaz Agro-Technical School.



Brother Ghebreyesus, did his initial formation and his Primary and Secondary education in Eritrea. He did his Undergraduate and Graduate studies in Psychology in Rome, Italy, at UPS (Salesian Pontifical University). Since his return to Eritrea in 1988, he has been involved in various capacities as religious educator and administrator. Brother Ghebryesus has been Director of St. Joseph's School, Keren, of the Institute of Religious Studies in Asmara and currently, the Principal of Hagaz Agro Technical School and the Management of the Project concurrently.

Brother Ghebreyesus was Sector Coordinator of the Sector of Eritrea for twelve years. He was also involved in the accompaniment of the young Brothers of the Sector and was responsible for the Formation and accompaniment of the young Brothers.

1.2. FROM FORMATION OFFICE

1. SOME STATISTICS

At the beginning of the year 2014, January 23rd, we had 20 Juniors, 14 Postulants, 7 first year Novices, 13 second year Novices, 4 first year Scholastics, 5 second year Scholastics, 3 third year Scholastics, 5 Brothers in their apostolic immersion experience, 4 fourth year Scholastics and 6 Brothers in temporary vows in apostolic communities.

In addition, we have 2 Scholastics from the District of West Africa whose Brother Provincial Visitor paid them a much appreciated visit at the beginning of this month, 5 Scholastics and 1 Student Brother from the Delegation of Rwanda, and 1 Scholastic from the District of Antananarivo.

2. BROTHERS' SOLIDARITY ASSEMBLY IN THE ETHIOPIAN SECTOR

Four Brothers, i.e. Brothers in temporary vows and in the first two years of final vows, participated in this yearly Assembly that took place at the La Salle Retreat Centre

in DebreZeit, Ethiopia, at the beginning of February 2014.

The first day was animated by Brother Marc on the District Development Policy. The theme was initiated with two pictures: a boat with people that symbolized the Ethiopian Sector with the pertinent question: *are we not in one and the same boat? Vow of association*, and an exhausted and preoccupied banker surrounded with files and computer that symbolized the Ethiopian Sector on the road to self-sufficiency in economic resources with the pertinent question: *do we have a common vision and a common future? Vow of stability*. This was followed by a reflection on **a brief history of Lasallian Expansionism** with its three main stages marked by different outlooks and perspectives of the agents of its expansionism. It helped us to understand better the background of today's Finance and Development Policy of the Institute since the 42nd General Chapter (1993) and of

today's Finance and Development Policy of the Charles Lwanga District of Africa.

The next two days were animated by Brother Marc on behalf of Brother Anton Oloo and of Brother Patrick Obama who participated in the International Assembly of Young Brothers that took place in the Philippines. We had a very lively, insightful and open-minded discussion on the major texts and declarations of this important Assembly. We had the opportunity to share our own ideas, concerns, convictions and hopes with one another.

Ambrose Okeke, the President of the Association, regretted that because of the various commitments members of the Association had, they were unable to come sooner to offer their condolences upon Brother Uba's passing. He eulogized Brother Uba for the vision he had for uniting Nigerian students and missionaries in Kenya by forming the association. After the Mass, the association members who were about 80 in number, from about 13 different Communities had a social moment as they shared food and beverages they had brought for the occasion. Brother Damian, on behalf of the Nigerian Brothers, thanked the members of the Association for taking such initiative to honour the late Brother Uba. At the gathering it emerged that the association President had missionary commitments in Isiolo which were going to distract him from running the affairs of the association, and an election was conducted to choose a new leader. Our very own Brother Julius Adi, the Sub Director of Scholasticate became the President of the

Association of Nigerian Priests and Religious in Kenya. Congratulations Brother Julius!

ST. JOSEPH'S KEREN EXCELS AGAIN!

It is becoming generally customary, that St. Joseph's School being among the top Schools in the external exams of Grade Eight and in the Matriculation (ESLCE) Grade 12.

St. Joseph's School has again emerged at the top guaranteeing its status in both Grades country wise. We are so happy and proud to announce that our school stood first in the National Grade Eight Examination by achieving a 100% rate and in the Grade Twelve Matriculation achieving second position with 81.4%.

The other encouraging factor is that 82% of our Grade 8 students scored above 70 %

average, 32% of our students scored above 80% average and 14% scored above 90% average in the National Examination. This is an exceptional result when compared with the other schools in the country.

The School is first in both Grades in the Region, and first and third respectively in Grades Eight and Twelve country wise. We congratulate the teaching staff, the administration staff and the students for the tremendous performance. It is to be remembered that the School achieved similar success the previous year. This shows the school is clearly growing steadily in educational excellence. Hurray, St. Joseph's! Keep marching!

LA SALLE CLUB; BEST KEPT SECRETS

La Salle Sport Club is an Eritrean club based in St. Joseph's School Keren. It is one of the most successful clubs in Keren. It includes foot ball, basket ball (boys and girls), volley ball and cycling teams. It was founded in 1952 by De La Salle Brothers under the leadership of Brother Jose Salces Gonzalez a Spanish Brother who worked in Eritrea between 1952 - 1973. Brother Gonzalez was commonly known as Michael Chahima in the local language which means Michel with the bread. Brother Gonzalez was also assisted by Yugoslavian Dr. Santokinik who was working in Keren at that time. Since its foundation the Club has been successful in aspect of sports. It has won many tournaments ever since.

The club has most recently established itself as home ground for training young players as young as 10. La Salle Football Club particularly since 2007 has trained its own players rather than searching for players in the market. Therefore La Salle Football Club has teams in First Division, Second Division and Third Division. It has kids playing at all grassroots football tournaments.

This year in particular the club has been blessed to have seen its first group of players that have trained for more than 5 years in the grassroots level play in the First Division and be one of the most dreaded teams. The average age of the players this year is 19.

They have become successful by reaching second place in the First Division on goal difference. The best player and top scorer being Aron Kiflay from La Salle, and Ermias Ghebrekidan (Maju) the best goalkeeper.

On the other hand the ladies Basketball team also became champions this year while the boys stood second in the same tournament. Fertuna Yohannes from La Salle also become the best player in the ladies tournament. Sefu Kidne from our team was also awarded a special medal for playing and leading the basket ball team for over 35 years.

Our Girls finished the competition holding the second position and our Sports' teacher was named the best coach of the year. It seems that our school has understood the manifold advantages of sport activities for academic excellence.

NEWS FROM SAINT JOSEPH CATHOLIC SCHOOL IN ADAMA!

As it is well known, St. Joseph School has been working hard in shaping students in discipline, knowledge and skills. “*Teaching Minds and Touching hearts*,” is used as a slogan in the school.

This is the second week of the second semester. The class assessment result has been collected from daily activities in class, projects works, assignments and short tests. These were performed based on each teacher’s plan. The summative assessments of this year’s first semester, was conducted on the schedules set in the school academic calendar. We will have the Parent’s Day on Sunday 23rd February 2014.

There is a very strong demand from the Education Office that we need to open one stream of Oromiffa language. The school operates the Amharic section. According to them, since the school is offering a quality education for all, the local people “the Oromos” are not benefiting from the school in academics. Hence, we have requested

them to write an official request letter so that we could submit it to the office of the Lwanga District.

Teachers’ supervision was conducted in our school both formally and informally for the Elementary and High School sections. The informal supervisions are performed using the forms set at the beginning of the year.

For the first time, the Scout Club is being established in the school in this academic year. The members of the clubs have taken four Saturdays training to understand what scout is all about and what it takes to be a member of the Scout Club. The members of the Scout Club will receive their Certificate during Parents’ Day.

The De LaSalle and the Girls’ for Success Clubs showed exemplary activities working together. Member students, teachers and Brothers planned to collect stationery and clothes for students who have serious problems in De La Salle School in Adama

Town. This school was established with the help of Brother Taddele and Brother Martine. The club members planned a lunch with students on Christmas celebration in the school and it was conducted very well. Besides, stationery and clothes gathered from the school community have been donated to those students who are under privileged

Here at La Salle we have got off to a good start with the news that our Matric (Senior Certificate) class of 2013 achieved 100% success in the I.E.B. Matric. Schools in S.A. may choose to do the Government Exam or the I.E.B. (Independent Examination Board) Exam. Most Private schools do the I.E.B. because it is deemed to be of higher standard. Catholic Schools in our Province of Gauteng achieved 99% Pass Rate against 72.5% for Government schools.

De La Salle Holy Cross College in Victory Park had a tremendous result – 100% and all its students qualified for University Entrance. One student achieved 11 A's (Distinctions). A Distinction means 80%+. Most students take only 6 subjects.

Since classes resumed there have been a number of Parent Information evenings during which they were addressed by visiting lecturers dealing with such themes as “Bullying”, “Parenting the Modern Child”. Counselors and House Captains in our Grade XII class attended a leadership weekend.

Br. Thomas attended Ethos meetings and Board meetings in both schools. Ethos is always the first item on the agenda. We have a new Chairman on the Board at La Salle. He is Kevin De Beer, a Methodist minister, and a past pupil of the school. Two of his children attend La Salle. A true Lasallian.
