A brief introduction

- St. John's College High was founded in 1851
- Through most of its history, St. John's was an all male, military school
- In the 1990's the school became co-ed and military optional
- With over 1,200 students today, St. John's is one of the largest Lasallian high schools in the United States.



Lasallian education is world-wide

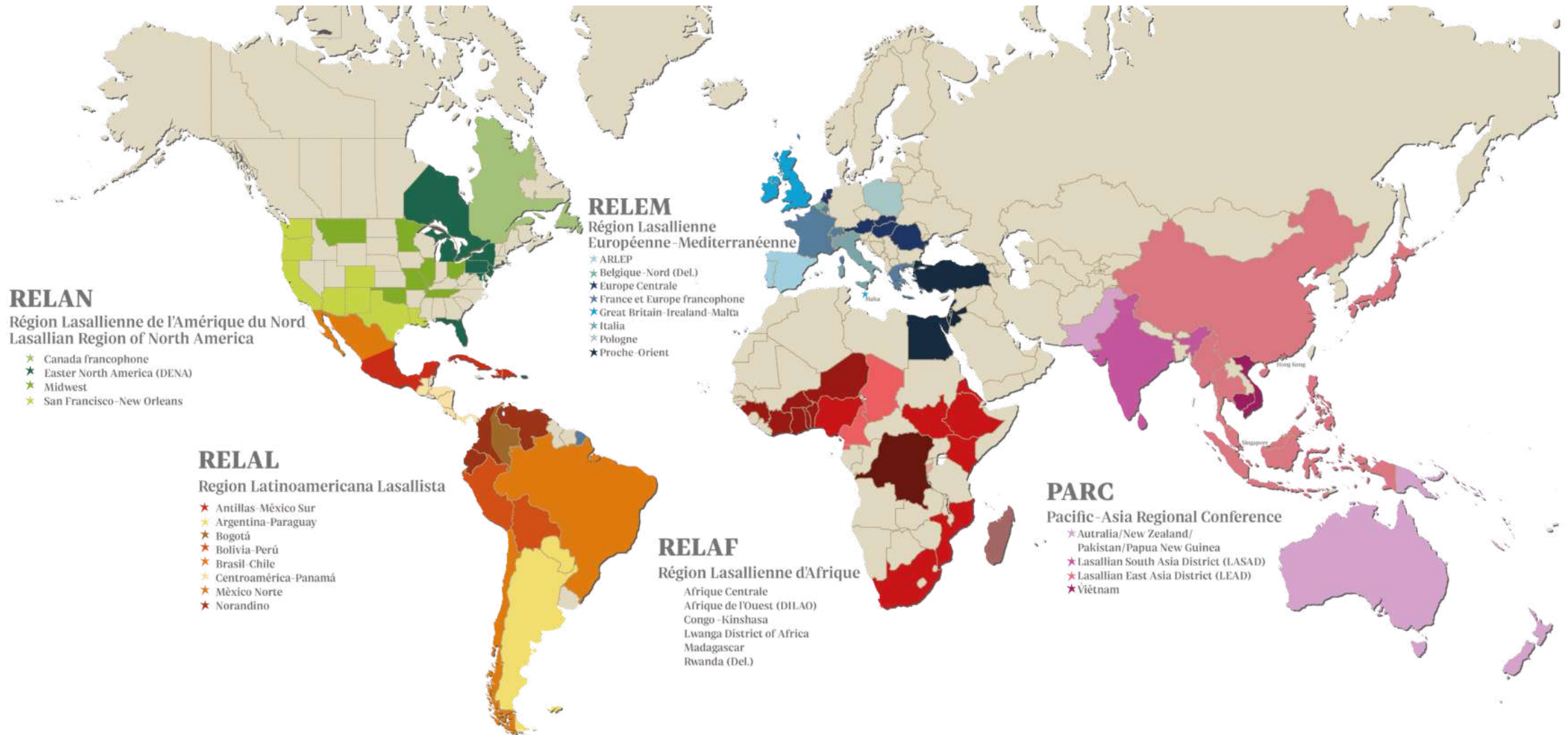
Today, approximately 3,100 Christian Brothers and 104,600 Lasallian lay partners serve 1,000,000 young people in 1,100 educational ministries in 79 countries around the world.

“Together and By Association”

- Outside of the daily work of teaching, most schools have supplementary programs to educate faculty on the life and pedagogy of De La Salle.
- Lasallians from geographically-close schools and other ministries come together once or twice a year to also “associate for mission.”
- The US Conference Office organizes national meetings and programs.
- Almost anytime Lasallians are together (like today) discussing our shared mission to provide a human and Christian education they are “in association.”

- There are 28 Signum Fidei Fraternities around the world.
- Members live in community and support the Lasallian mission and charism.

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- Schools and other Lasallian ministries in RELAN raise money for schools and programs for in Africa. Schools are specifically twinned with ministries in Africa.
 - While the government nationalized St. Joseph School and Nativity School in Eritrea, the Brothers are continuing to provide services through the Lasallian Youth in Eritrea.
